March	Harmony Day & Multi-cultural Food Fair	Students are encouraged to wear orange, national-themed clothes or school uniform to celebrate Harmony Day. At 3pm there is an afternoon tea of multicultural food in the school hall.	Families are asked to bring food to share from their culture/country.
March	Leadership Camp	School captains and vice-captains participate in a leadership camp at Narrabeen Sports Academy with other leaders from local schools.	
April/last week of term 1	Parent Teacher Interviews	1 on 1 meetings with your child's teacher. Held in the school hall in blocks of 10 minutes. All parents and carers encouraged to attend.	Book your timeslot online via the School Interviews Website.
April	School Disco	A fun event held in our school hall from 5pm-7pm with a DJ. Each year has a different dress up theme and the teachers and students love to get involved. 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March/April	Easter Hat Parade and Morning Tea	Easter Morning Tea, raffles plus Easter Hat Parade. Parents are usually asked to bring donations of Easter craft items as hats are made in class, and chocolates or toys that can be added to Easter raffle hampers. April	Citizenship Honour Assembly Term 1	A special assembly where awards are handed out based on citizenship. Assembly could involve performances by the school band, school choir or presentations from students.	This is organised by the school. May	Life Education	The Life Education van visits each year to educate Australian children on making healthy lifestyle choices.	Payment included in the school invoice.
Мау	Athletics Carnival	Held at the Academy of Sports at Narrabeen. Open to all students with events including 100m, 200m, 800m and field events. Students turning 8 or above have the opportunity to advance to Zone Carnival (held at end of August). K-2 students participate in novelty events as well. School organises buses to transport the students to and from the venue.	Parents encouraged as spectators and helpers on the day. November	Fun Day	Students can wear mufti for the day as they walk around the school and participate in games and activities. You can help by donating items to be used as prizes for the games and activities.	Organised by Year 6 students and parents to raise funds for their end of year Graduation evening.
November/ December	Swim School	Two week program for 150 children from Years 2 to 6 to participate in swimming lessons each day at Fitness First Dee Why.	Communicated through the school newsletter and payment required for each student

December	Kindy Graduation Day	All Kindy parents are invited to see the graduation of the kindergarten kids after their first year at school. All students receive a certificate and the students will perform some songs.	An afternoon tea will be held organised by the kindergarten parents.
December	Year 6 Graduation Evening 6-9pm	An evening for Year 6 students and staff to celebrate the Year 6 students finishing their primary school education. Typically held at Manly Leagues Club. Parents are at 8pm for speeches, to see students receive their graduation certificate and for a final dance.	Communicated through newsletter and notes sent home.
December	Christmas Carols Night	Each year will prepare a Christmas Carol to sing on the night. There will be a sausage sizzle on the night and battery candles to buy. Prior to the event, parents are asked to donate Christmas goodies and gifts to make up Christmas raffle hampers. Raffles drawn during the carols night. December	Presentation Day Assembly	A special assembly where awards are handed out and the school groups such as the band and choir may perform. Awards include academic achievement, consistent effort, encouragement, citizenship and excellence in all areas. Sport and extra curricula awards are also given out. One assembly will be held for K-2 and another for 3-6.	This is organised by the school. The parents of people who are award recipients will receive a letter prior to the event inviting them to attend.
December	K-2 Picnic Day	K-2 children walk to Beverley Park for the morning. Students participate in games at the park before heading back to school for lunch and a movie.	This is organised by the school. Expect a note containing information closer to the event.
December	3-6 Picnic Day	3-6 children head to a park in the local area for games and activities. Students take their own food and drinks for the day.	This is organised by the school. Expect a note containing information closer to the event.
December	Year 6 Graduation Walk Out	The whole school asked to form a guard of honour as students leave the school for the last time. Classes line up from Year 6 classrooms to the gate at the Top Playground.
