7.2. Canteen Report – Sarah C.		
All is going well since last update, 1st week back of term went well biggest 1st week back this year.		
The canteen as been decorated with Hallow	veen themed items which the children have really enjoyed and been	

- The canteen as been decorated with Halloween themed items which the children have really enjoyed and been commenting on.
- They are all looking forward to the Halloween recess canteen treat day on 31st October, more information regarding what will be sold, and cost will be put out soon hoping to keep everything at \$2 or under.
- ➤ Hot Chocolate has been turned off for the year.
- Pink Moosies are no longer an approved item for sale in the canteen due to sugar content (blue and chocolate are still allowed), pink moosies have been replaced with Rainbow paddle pops (they are an approved item by healthy canteens healthy canteen rating doesn't change) and have been received well by the children no surprises there.
- ➤ Looking at introducing fruit smoothies on a Monday and if popular enough extending to other days.
- An email to class parents has been sent out, reminding parents of children who participate in PSSA on a Friday to mark PSSA when ordering.
- A reminder about Birthday treats not being brought in from home, packing cutlery if their child has food that needs it, and that the canteen is unable to reheat food brought in from home.
- I was also contacted a while back from a school ordering system Spriggy about changing from Flexi schools to them. I did some research, and this is what I found.
- You can do canteen, uniform shop, and event/fundraising through it.
- > Spriggy has not withdrawal fees, no top up fees, no subscription fees no inactivity fees and chargers \$0.29 for orders.
- If you have more than one child you can order for both before completing transaction, unlike Flexi Schools you have to order for child 1, pay and then go back in and order for child 2 and pay and so on.
- Flexi schools' charges fees on top of the 0.29 cents so a \$5 meal becomes \$5.29 then if you pay with Pay Pal you incur another 12cents bring it to \$5.41. So, an extra 41 cents and if you have multiple children the order for that child incurs the fees too.
- Then if you order recess all those fees get charged again. With Spriggy it is just a flat 29cents per order.
- Flexischool takes 3% of the total sales, Spriggy takes 1% so more profit for example, canteen makes \$3,500 flexi schools gets \$105 of that Spriggy would take \$35.
- Spriggy would do all the set up and their app is free for families to download and set up.
- Had a few students asking and some parents as to whether the canteen was looking taking cards for payment instead of cash at recess and lunch for over-the-counter orders. Said I would discuss with p and c.
